

# Pastoral Ponderings

*“Faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead.” (James 2:17)*

On June 6, 2010, Bishop Violet Fisher was invited to be our guest speaker for our 99<sup>th</sup> Red Rose Sunday, marking the 99<sup>th</sup> year that the current sanctuary had been used by JUMC (after first worshipping in a building at the corner of Walnut and Broad Streets). That day, kicked off a series of Sunday morning celebrations (with guest speakers like our current bishop, Peggy Johnson, and former members like Jim Artz), as well as special evening and afternoon events. This series of events was intended to lead us to our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration on **June 12, 2011**. [A day when we will have only **one worship service at 9:30 am**, and no Sunday School.]

As we prepare for that day, I want to highlight something that another one of our anniversary speakers said on May 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011. On that day, Brian Albert spoke about the life and ministry of his aunt, Elizabeth Albert. Elizabeth had been a member here, and had served as a missionary in Taiwan for 36 years. In Brian’s stories, we heard how Elizabeth, as a single woman of 29, boarded a freighter in New York in 1956 for a several weeks journey to a place she had never been, to work with people she had never met, in order to follow God’s call. Over the next three and a half decades she would repeat that journey again and again (eventually being able to travel by air). But in each of those journeys, she gave up the comforts of home, packed her belongings into steamer trunks, and journeyed into the unknown to follow a God who said *“Follow Me”* (Matthew 4:19). Such an example should cause us to ask *“Just how much do WE sacrifice to follow God’s call?”* After all, while God may not call us to become a missionary to China, God does call us to follow Him here in Pennsylvania, reaching out in His name, working with Him to meet the needs in our community, and helping our church to do everything that God is calling it to do to bring people into relationship with Jesus.

Thus, when we gather together on **June 12, 2011**, at **9:30 am**, we will not only be celebrating the past, but also beginning the future. This is because we will not be gathering together for a funeral service, to merely remember what HAD occurred in mission and ministry at JUMC over the LAST 100 years but is no longer happening. We will also be gathering to be readied, prepared, and commissioned to carry out ministry over the NEXT 100 years. For even though we may not personally see each of those 100 years, it is OUR RESPONSIBILITY to get the ball rolling. It is our responsibility, our calling, to step forth in mission and ministry ourselves, so that 100 years from now another group of JUMC members can look back on all that we – through faith, and the power of God’s grace – were able to accomplish. How can you be part of that?

Commit to three things: **Celebration, Cell, Call**. **Celebration** is what Christians do when they gather together each Sunday to worship. **Cell** describes the willingness to join a small group, like a Bible study, Sunday School class, or prayer or ministry group. **Call** is the list of things we do to show to the world that our faith is not dead. For as James went on to say *“Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith”* (James 2:18). How are you showing your faith? Where are you involved in the ministry of JUMC? That, after all, is how life is meant by God to be lived: receiving God’s love and forgiveness through the ministries of the Church, and then - through one’s own active participation in the ministries of the Church – sharing those same blessings with others. Those who do find (as it says in Matthew 5) that they are blessed. We invite you therefore to seek that blessing here at JUMC. Your life will never be the same if you do.

Turning the tables around, some are saying that things are desperate enough in today's cultural climate, to have several prayer partners focusing on one youth. Our kids need to be brought before the Lord (intercession) frequently and from many voices. We don't need to double our efforts; we need to quadruple them. This is the new challenge. Team prayer for one youth.

*"as you help us by your prayers. Then many will give thanks on our behalf for the gracious favor granted us in answer to the prayers of many."* 1 Cor 1:11

The students from the NL graduating class of 2011 that have passed through our doors is huge. I have a list of 29 students who have been as least somewhat involved in our church. I am sure that I missed some. The most blessed are held tight in our grasp by families that have maintained a commitment to church attendance throughout their lives. This is the most beautiful arrangement to behold. Like a tree planted on the water, it is not moved easily.

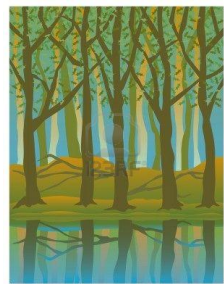

## **MISSIONARY AND MISSION ORGANIZATION SUPPORT**

Your giving through the General Fund as well as the **Mission Fund Envelope** on the third Sunday of each month goes toward helping us meet our financial obligations to ALL these ministries as well as our general mission commitments thereby helping Christ make a difference in the world. So you know a little more about the various organizations listed above, we will be highlighting one each month.

**Rev. Dr. Simon Nderitu is a graduate of Evangelical School of Theology, Myerstown, PA. He and his wife, Joyce, work in evangelism and Christian leadership training in Kenya, Africa. They work in church planting, Bible teaching, and organizing Christian conferences and conventions. They also direct ministries working with those who have HIV/AIDS, the underprivileged, and those who are physically and mentally handicapped. Other ministries provide job skill training for youth so that they may become self-reliant and responsible adults.**

**Pray for support for Simon and Joyce Nderitu. Since they have begun their ministries themselves, they do not have the support of a mission organization and depend on donations. They need money to feed their family and pay basic bills. Although Joyce has tried to find part-time work, there is nothing available in that area.**

**Pray for the Greenhouse Church, their new church plant. Pray that funds will come in so that construction on the church will be able to be completed.**

**Pray for their ministry to needy children.**

**Pray for funds so that they can help people who need food: children in their area, and also families that are displaced as a result of chaotic situations in Kenya and other parts of Africa.**
